Welcome! For over 23 years, the Medical Ethics Short Course (MESc) has provided essential Bioethics training for the Military Healthcare Community. After a 3-year hiatus, the Walter Reed-Bethesda Department of Pastoral Care and Hospital Ethics Committee are pleased to reintroduce the Short Course. Supervisors are encouraged to grant subordinates scheduling flexibility to allow those interested the opportunity to attend.

The MESc is designed to help increase your competence in addressing the ethical issues you encounter in providing medical care. A combination of lectures, case studies, discussions, and training will cover the core issues of ethical theories, principles, and methods, key bioethics cases, evolving standards for ethics consultation, and areas of clinical ethical controversy and consensus. Our faculty of over 12 subject matter experts come from diverse professional backgrounds and will present 21 class hours of instruction and training.

New to the Medical Ethics short course is the introduction of 4 individual 3-hour specialty tracks of in-depth training, role-playing, discussion and advanced training in the following areas: *

- ❖ Ethics Consultation
- ❖ Advance Medical Directives & The Five Wishes
- ❖ Medical Ethical Decision Making
- ❖ Spirituality in Healthcare/Spiritual Assessment

The 2013 WRNMMC Medical Ethics Short Course has been approved for 20.75 hours of CME accreditation with the Council for Continuing Medical Education, and is seeking 21 Category I CEU credits from the Maryland Board of Social Work Examiners. 3. Click on “**REQUEST LOGIN ID**”, after establishing your Login ID and password click on “**LOG IN**” and log in.
