Target Audience / Scope of Practice

Target Audience: This intensive course is designed for members of ethics committees and others interested in ethical aspects of clinical practice. The target audience are Military and DOD physicians, ethics consultants, nurses, chaplains, social workers, health care administrators, respiratory and other therapists, human rights officers, patient representatives, psychologists, members of clinical ethics committees, organizational ethics task forces and ethics support services, risk managers, hospital attorneys and trustees. Any or all of these Military health professionals are invited to attend.

Scope of Practice: Every healthcare encounter involves some level of ethical implication and potential for uncertainty and conflict. The MESC will incorporate and leverage the knowledge of common ethical problems and dilemmas in medicine, and present strategies to address them. The course is designed to help participants increase their competence in addressing and resolving ethical questions in medical care. A combination of lectures, case discussions, training and seminars will cover the core issues of ethical theories, principles, and methods, key bioethics cases, evolving standards for ethics consultation, and areas of clinical ethical controversy and consensus. The course is designed to meet professionals where they are, engage at all levels, introducing concepts and theory with best practice and to enhance and strengthen current competencies. The course will also introduce the basics of Medical Ethics.
