## **Program Description**

The model stresses exposure to multiple theoretical orientations and techniques. Rotations include Outpatient, Primary Care, Neuropsychology, and Assessment. The outpatient rotation involves supervised interview assessments and short-term treatment-cognitive-behavioral, short-term dynamic and other techniques. The primary care rotations is embedded within the medical clinic and involves brief evaluations of medical patients with recommendations and interventions aimed at symptom reduction and functional outcome. Assessment rotation involves personality testing [Objective and Projective measures] for diagnosis, treatment planning and disposition. The neuropsychology rotation involves neurocognitive screens, mental health screens, and treatment of injured military members. A long-term individual case is carried throughout the year with weekly supervision. A range of seminars are presented. Seminars range from 3 hours to two-day workshops and may include Rorschach, MMPI-2, MCMI III, PAI, Psychodynamic Theory and Practice, Assessment and Treatment of Suicidal Patients, Family Therapy, Models of Group Therapy, Ethics, Operational Psychology, Introduction to Neuropsychology, Cognitive Remediation of Brain Dysfunction, Psychotherapy and Neuroscience, Cultural Competence, and Dialectic Behavioral Therapy. The internship faculty recognizes that it is essential to begin at each intern's level of professional development and provide opportunities through which existing skills can be refined and new skills assimilated. The goal of this internship is to train clinical psychologists who are capable of functioning with professional autonomy in a variety of applied settings in the Army.

The Navy and Army Internship programs will maintain separate APA accreditation, but be co-located at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Bethesda, Maryland on the former site of the National Naval Medical Center.

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
